- Settlement—a place where people establish a community
- Longship—a long, narrow warship

<p><b>AD 793</b></p> <p>The Vikings attack the island of Lindisfarne.</p>	<p><b>AD 866</b></p> <p>The Vikings capture the city of York.</p>	<p><b>AD 871</b></p> <p>Alfred the Great becomes the king of Wessex.</p>	<p><b>AD 878</b></p> <p>They settle permanently in England.</p>	<p><b>AD 1042</b></p> <p>Edward the Confessor is invited to return to Normandy to become the king of England.</p>
<p><b>AD 886</b></p> <p>King Alfred agrees to a treaty with the Vikings.</p>	<p><b>AD 900</b></p> <p>The Vikings rule the North of Scotland.</p>	<p><b>AD 954</b></p> <p>The last Viking king of Jorvik is forced out of York.</p>	<p><b>AD 1013</b></p> <p>King Sven of Denmark and his son Cnut sail up the rivers Humber and Trent to claim the throne.</p>	<p><b>AD 1066</b></p> <p>King Harold is defeated in the battle of Hastings.</p>
