## Communication and Language:

- Listens to and enjoys rhythmic patterns in rhymes and stories, trying to join in with action or vocalisations (LA).
- Understands who, what, where in simple questions (U).
- Uses a variety of questions (what, where, who). Learns new vocab linked to topic (S).

## Expressive Arts and Design:

- Explore and experiment with an increasing range of media and movement through sensory exploration (CWM).
- Begin to make believe (BIE).

#### Mathematics:

- Begins to say numbers in order (C).
- Enjoys filling and emptying containers (SA).
- Begins to make simple constructions (S)
- Begins to exploring shape and common shape names, (S).

## <u>Physical Development:</u>

- Develops independence in self-care and shows an awareness of routines (HSC).
- Begin to recognise danger and seeks the support from a familiar adult (HSC).
- Dances and sings to music rhymes and sings, imitating movements of others (MxH).

- Enjoys learning about other family customs (KUW).
- Talk about how we prepare and celebrate Christmas with our friends and families (PC).

#### <u>Development:</u>


- Share and respect our toys and resources in Nursery (UE).

- Enjoys playing alone, alongside others and playing with their friends (MR).


#### <u>Literacy</u>

# Online Safety:

- Check apps, websites and search results before using them with children.
- Supervise children when accessing the internet or apps.
- Role model safe behaviour and privacy awareness. Talk to children about safe use, for example ask permission before taking a child's picture even if parental consent has been given.
