
Each Year group also has a designated ETA, who works alongside the class teacher to deliver pre/post teaching activities, interventions etc as signposted on class provision maps/pupil passports/MSP/EHCP

#### **Training and Support**

- Staff meetings linked to One Page Profiles, MSPs, Provisions Maps, First Quality teaching, and understanding the graduated approach
- > All staff members are Team Teach trained.
- The SENDCO has achieved the National SENDCO Award
- The Well-Being Lead has completing Mental Health First Aid Training and this is now being disseminated to all staff
- The SEND lead has accessed Kirklees SENDCO network meetings and pyramid ANP meetings
- Foundation Stage support staff are ELKLAN trained
- Key Workers with 1:1 children work closely with professionals from different agencies to complete the recommendations and programmes set.
- > The Nursery Nurse has completed Portage Teacher Training

## Provisions Maps and Parents/Carers

- > Provision Maps are reviewed and updated termly by teachers.
- One Page Profiles and My Support Plans are reviewed termly and parents/teachers meetings are undertaken to review the targets set.
- Education, Health Care plans are review annually by a range of professionals involved with the child and parents/carers. Pupil passports are also in place for these children and reviewed termly.
